

RULES:

- Participants are required to attend the safety meeting prior to match.
- Participants must adhere to SASS-CAS dress code guidelines at the range.
- **Eye and ear protection** is required for all participants and spectators during the event.
- Time + miss(es) + penalties = total time/score.
- The match is scored as total time.
- **Parental/Adult Consent & Supervision** is required for all competitors under 18 years of age.

COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING:

- **SASS** and local rules apply.
- Shooters must indicate their Alternate Shooting Category at registration/check-in.
- In the Frontier Cartridge category, shooters may shoot "Gunfighter," "Duelist," or "Traditional" style. Pistols may be either cartridge or cap and ball.
- This is a six-stage match.
- Round count for the match will be 60 rifle, 60 pistol, and 25+ shotgun.

WILD BUNCH ACTION SHOOTING:

- SASS & local rules apply.
- **SASS Wild Bunch Action Shooting** rules require a rifle of .38 caliber or greater.
- Participants may shoot any SASS legal rifle, however, if their rifle is less than .38 caliber, they will not be eligible to receive a medal.
- This is a six-stage match.
- Round count for the match will be 60 rifle, 168 pistol, and 36 shotgun.

SPECIAL INFO:

- **Registration** Include Alias and SASS# (if available) on registration form.
- SASS rules and information available at www.sassnet.com.
- Ammunition must conform to SASS requirements.
- **The maximum velocities are 1000 fps for pistols & revolvers and 1400 fps for rifles.**
- Ammunition that exceeds these velocities is considered illegal.
- Shooters whose ammunition is suspected of exceeding these levels will be required to cease shooting and must procure and use conforming ammunition if they wish to continue the match.
- SASS rules require a 60-power factor for CAS, & 150-power factor for .45 acp & 60-power factor for rifle for WBAS.
- Only lead bullets with no gas checks may be used.
- Montana Territory Peacemakers is the hosting cowboy action shooting club.
